Our project for the Spring Term is 'Number, shape, colour and pattern'.



When we help children to start noticing and identifying patterns we talk about shapes, colours and numbers to make connections.

When setting up our nursery environment we carefully select images, photographs and books for children to access to support their learning in these areas which form a basis to early mathematical learning.

The children have access to a wide range of materials supporting this, such as building blocks and other construction resources, small parts such as mosaic tiles and sorting cups, and a wide range of art resources. Using these materials, we help the children to identify the numbers, colours, shapes and patterns that surround them. This helps them develop self-confidence as they start to understand more about their world.

Our House of Maths workshop this term will complement our project nicely.

The Spring Term sees the children celebrating seasonal festivals such as....

Chinese New Year, which for 2024 is The Year of the Dragon!



The holiday we sometimes call Chinese New Year in English is known as chūnjié in Chinese, or Spring Festival.

Everyone wears red, a lucky colour, and visits family and friends with gifts of oranges, flowers, sweets and special food items like sweet rice cakes, taro cake, or turnip cake. Adults give out red envelopes (hóngbāo) filled with lucky money to children and elders, and everyone enjoys fireworks, parades, banquets, and brightly lit lanterns at night.



The children love to learn about this vibrant festival, and particularly enjoy taking part in dragon dancing and sampling Chinese foods such as noodles and rice which they practice eating with chop sticks in the Chrysalis Chinese restaurant!

Valentine's Day sees an explosion of all things heart shaped in nursery!



Our Valentine's Day celebrations can also include conversations about our own heart, and how to keep it healthy with exercise and the types of food we eat.

The children listen to each other's hearts with a stethoscope to hear how exercise can increase the rate of our heart beat.




Pancake Day

We will be celebrating our lovely mummies on Mother's Day.



Some important reminders...

Applying for school places 2024

Parents with children due to start school for the first time in September 2024 will need to apply for their child's school place by **15 January 2024**. Parents must apply by this deadline for the best chance of getting a place at their preferred school.

New 2-year funding from April 2024

If you are hoping to access the new 2-yr funding for working families in April 2024 for any child in your family, you will need to apply for an HMRC eligibility code.

Dorset Council have advised us that parents will be able to apply for their eligibility code from **2nd January 2024**, and codes must be obtained by **31st March 2024** to use in the Summer term 2024.

· 3- & 4-year-old 30-hr funding

Hopefully by now, all parents who are newly 30hr-funded this January will have passed their HMRC code to the nursery. Codes with a start date after 31^{st} December 2023 will not be valid until the Summer Term (April 2024).

If you're already 30-hr funded, you'll need to pass a valid renewal date to the nursery as soon as possible if yours expires before the start of next term on 2nd January 2024.

· What do I need to bring into nursery for my child?

All your child needs to bring with them to nursery is a NAMED water bottle (water only please), a lunch box (see note below) and weather appropriate outdoor clothing eg coat, gloves, hat etc.

We carry spares of everything on site from a change of clothes, wipes, nappies, sunhats etc. In our continued effort to avoid too many items travelling to and from nursery we kindly request that children do NOT bring in any toys/teddies etc from home. Small items particularly, are likely to get lost or broken, so keep those treasured possessions for home please!



A note on lunch boxes.

Whilst we have a small fridge to accommodate the majority of lunch boxes that come into nursery, others need to be stored in a cupboard at room temperature and so we kindly request that ice packs are included in ALL children's lunch boxes (which should also be of the insulated variety).

Additionally, we are trying to reduce waste in the nursery as part of our commitment to reduce, reuse and recycle. We are finding that children are increasingly being given too much choice in their lunch boxes and are often overwhelmed by the quantity of food leading to lots of food wastage. Please provide healthy food of age-appropriate quantities. Snacks are provided by Chrysalis throughout the day and so no child will go hungry!
